Convention Line-Up

Stories Through Letters: The Stavig Letters: The Story of a Norwegian Immigrant will be presented by Curtis Dahl and Jane & John Rasmussen from the Sisseton area. It is a theater program based on a collection of letters written over a fifty-year period between two brothers, one who emigrated from Norway to Dakota Territory and one who stayed in Norway. It is part of the Speaker's Bureau of the SD Humanities Council. They have performed more than 75 times in the United States and Scandinavia.

Stories Through Art: The Redlin Center is another story we will explore. Terry Redlin tells a story through art in each painting he has done. We will be visiting the Center and have a program that shares the story behind Redlin's work.

Stories Through Essays: The Reminiscent Teacher Essays was the actual beginning of the stories theme for this convention. After celebrating the history of SDRSP last year, the essays were not recognized. Teacher experiences

were captured by many of our current members through essays they wrote. Some will be shared. Books similar to last year will be made to preserve the essays.

Stories That Never End: The Zubke's have agreed to present again. They always have memorable stories to share, but they are still "making up the story." More to come.

Pre-convention tours will include the Mellette House, the Watertown home of SD's first governor, Arthur Mellette. The historic 1880's Goss Opera House is another part of the tour.

Legislative Summary 2024

Not too many changes coming for the retirement system or education—so far. We never know what will occur during the legislative session, so stay tuned.

Following is a briefing of the retirement system's two bills:

SB 68

An Act to amend certain provisions pertaining to the South Dakota Retirement System to comply with federal law. The Issue and Background:

The United States Congress passed the SECURE 2.0 Act in December 2022, which revised the age for required minimum distributions (RMD). RMDs are the minimum amounts members must withdraw from their retirement accounts upon reaching a certain age or retiring, whichever comes later. A required reference update is also included.

- □Update age requirement for RMDs for members who attain age 72 after December 31, 2022, and age 73 before January 1, 2033, to age 73.

SB 69

An Act to amend certain provisions pertaining to the South Dakota Retirement System.

Legislative Summary:

- ☐ Clarify language for employer evaluation of disability. Section 1.
- □ Clarify language for health care provider evaluation of disability.
- ☐ Revise language to include waiver for spouse's signature in the case of an absent spouse for benefit start.

The Actuarial Statement: Senate Bills 68 & 69 will have no material impact on the liabilities or assets of SDRS. Now onto Medicaid.

AARP is concerned about the changes to Medicaid expansion. There is a movement to establish work requirements for certain individuals. SD voters settled this issue by overwhelmingly passing Amendment D, without the work requirements. This was in the November 2022 general election.

Of course, as usual, there are many legislative actions and bills. Pay attention to the ones you are interested in by going to: sdlegislature.gov.

Consider attending lobby day in Pierre. Sign up with AARP for the last Tuesday in January each year. Besides seeing and giving input to your SD Legislature you will have the best BBQ ribs ever.

Black Hills



The Keystone schoolhouse was built with Victorian architecture in 1900, cost \$10,000 for 300 students. It served as a schoolhouse until 1988 and was declared a historical

building.

Bonita Ley has been the driving force behind promoting the school as a destination field trip to help students learn history. Under Bonita's supervision, schools all over the Black Hills have received an invitation to bring classrooms of students to the Living History School. After the snow and before school ended, hundreds of children were able to see a school of the past with black blackboards, student desks tethered together and how to use slates to show their work.

Bonita Ley is retiring this year after 20 years of providing students with the opportunity of "old school" experiences. Students were provided with



some clothing like suspenders, long skirts and bonnets as they sat at the same desks used by past generations.

Bonita took on the job of the field trips for students because of her love of history, love of teaching and because she went to Keystone School. She has done it all

The Keystone Area Historical Society honored Bonita for her guidance and vision of this project. Bonita has received recognition at SDRSP for her extensive community service hours of work with the school and children. Black Hills Retired School Personnel members are amazed at Bonita's dedication in teaching visible/ hands on history to hundreds of students.


Madison
