2026 CONVENTION SPEAKERS

DR. BEN JONES is an American historian, academic administrator, State Historian, and Director of the South Dakota State Historical Society. Jones served 23 years in the United States Air Force, where he attained the rank of lieutenant colonel, and taught at the Air Force Academy. He was dean of the College of Arts and Sciences at Dakota State University from 2013 to 2019. He was previously Secretary of Education of South Dakota from January 2019 to December 2020. Ben is the chairman of America's 250 Birthday Celebrations. He will be speaking about the celebrations and events across our state.



TONY VENHUIZEN is a lifelong South Dakotan. He serves as the 40th Lieutenant Governor of South Dakota. An Armour native, Venhuizen earned degrees from South Dakota State University and the University of South Dakota Knudson School of Law and was a 2004 Truman Scholar. He represented District 13 in the South Dakota Legislature from 2023–2025, serving as vice chair of House Appropriations and chairing the Legislature's 100th Session Planning Committee. He also spent ten years in the Governor's Office, including as chief of staff to Governors Dennis Daugaard and Kristi Noem, and previously served on the Board of Regents. Venhuizen currently serves on several statewide

boards and, with his wife Sara, has three children and attends Holy Spirit Catholic Church in Sioux Falls. He will be presenting "Stories About South Dakota's Governors."

KEVIN KUMPF and his wife, Ashley, own the Farr House in Pierre. It was built in 1904 by Dr. Mary Noyes-Farr and her husband, Civil War Colonel Edward Farr. Kevin is active in community theatre and the Short Grass Arts Council in the Pierre area.

- Prevent abuse through education.




They serve 6 counties around Pierre and last year they helped over 300 clients.

Newsletter expense so far is \$2223.95. We have another newsletter in this fiscal year.



Legislative Update

The South Dakota Retirement System has introduced five bills during this legislative session. These bills offer no significant changes to how SDRS benefits are administered. These are basically cleanup bills required of the SDRS.

SB 50 Updates the reference to the internal revenue code to reflect current federal law for the administration of SDRS statutes.

SB 51 Revises certain requirements for contesting actions of the SDRS.

SB 52 Clarifies statutes governing the administration of disability benefits by the SDRS.

SB 53 Ensures uniformity in member identification provisions governing the SDRS

SB 65 Revises certain required minimum distribution provisions of the SDRS

The Cost-of-Living Allowance for retirees for 2026 will be 1.56%

Erik Nelson and the AARP SD team will continue to monitor these bills as they move through the legislature.




What's on my bookshelf?
