The Future of YARSP

Following a brief but informative discussion of both possibilities—dissolution or continuation—the group decided to continue the organization with a revised format. The first major change is that the number of meetings will increase from six to nine (the first Thursday of September through May). The second change is the the format will be informalized, i.e. there will be not set agenda, allowing for a more casual interaction among members. The group also decided to continue the Dues as presently set (\$10 local; \$15 state) to maintain local projects, especially the scholarship program, and to support the state organization's lobbyist and information service. In addition, members are encouraged to contribute directly to the scholarship fund through memorials and donations.

The Co-Presidents (David and Donna Fischer) will continue in office, as will Vice-President Marily Kratz and Treasurer Gene Bormann. However, Joyce Maggied did usurp Nora Lee's office of Secretary. Arlene Young maintains her position as Social Secretary, with Reynold Loecker and Joyce Maggied on the scholarship committee.
